2021 EXAM RESULTS

Exam results this summer for both A Level and GCSE were once again superb. At A Level, 63% of girls achieved at least 3 A*/A grades with 39% of entries graded A*, 68% graded A*/A and 87% graded A*/B. At GCSE, 60% of grades were at level 8/9 (A*) and 81% at level 7 and above (A*/A). Given the difficult time both year groups experienced over the course of the pandemic, Year 11 and College 2 should be especially proud of all they have achieved. We are delighted to say that all College II students succeeded in gaining a place at their first choice university and we wish all our leavers the very best for the future.
