THE MOUNT'S 20TH PRINCIPAL

We are pleased to offer our congratulations and a very warm welcome to David Griffiths, who assumed the post of Principal of The Mount in January 2022. David has a wealth of diverse experience and an exemplary track record as a leader in education. He was previously Headmaster of Wycombe Abbey School in Changzhou, China, a branch school affiliated to Wycombe Abbey School in UK, and prior to that held senior positions at leading UK independent boarding schools. Whilst in China, he was also technical advisor to the China Rugby Football Association (CRFA).

David is The Mount's 20th Principal since the school moved to Castlegate in 1831 and the first man to take the helm since co-founder William Tuke retired in 1804. He has already increased The Mount's local, global and international reach and is strengthening the school's curricular offer to focus on academic excellence through providing enhanced co-curricular and super-curricular opportunities. Plans are in action to open the school's new Foundation Office later in the year.

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY 2022

On International Women's Day 2022, Old Scholar and former President of MOSA, Jocelyn Bell Burnell, visited The Mount for a Q&A session hosted by the College Leadership Team. The session was attended by pupils from Year 5 up to College II, as well as visiting pupils and staff from Queen Mary's School and Terrington Hall School. Afterward, Jocelyn chatted with pupils, staff and visitors during Choc Lunch, enjoyed a guided tour with Physics pupils, had Lunch in the Dining Room with Year 10 pupils and coffee with STEM teachers.

During the Q&A, Jocelyn explained how she strives to be a voice for women, particularly younger women.

"As you get older you can be more outrageous and be more blunt. Sometimes you need people to say, 'No, that's not right.' It tends to be useful for older women to say that."

Last year the school hosted an online Q&A for International Women's Day with Baroness Brenda Hale of Richmond, the former President of the UK Supreme Court and the first-ever woman to hold the role. In June an online Q&A was held with world-leading primatologist Dr Birute Galdikas. Each woman's inspiring story has suggested, at some point, that their respective field would benefit from greater diversity and representation from more sectors of society.
